PATRICK, MISSIONARY TO IRELAND

Patrick is one of the best-known of the missionary saints. Born to a Christian family in Britain around the year AD 389 he was captured as a teenager by raiders, taken to Ireland, and forced to serve as a herdsman. After six years, he escaped and found his way back to a monastery community in France. Ordained a bishop, it is believed that Patrick made his way back to Ireland in the summer of 433, and there spent the rest of his long life spreading the Gospel and organizing Christian communities. He strongly defended the doctrine of the Holy Trinity in a time when it was not popular to do so. His literary legacy includes his autobiography, *Confession*, and several prayers and hymns still used in the church today, including "I Bind Unto Myself Today" (LSB 604), set to an Irish tune, which we will sing as our concluding hymn tonight. At least one tradition states that Patrick died in Ireland on March 17 around the year AD 466.
