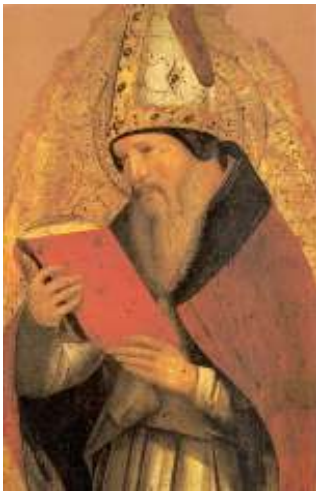

## ST. AUGUSTINE, ST. LUTHER, AND THEOLOGY TODAY



The sixteenth century Reformation of the Christian Church was profound and still influences our doctrine and practice today. We



Augustine taught that man is corrupted by original sin and that sin is a condition which needs the grace of God in Christ in order to be saved.

Luther began studying



are grateful to remember the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation and the fact that it is still about Jesus Christ and his life, death, and resurrection for us sinners, as he justifies us and declares us righteous by grace through faith.

Martin Luther was used by God to post the 95 Theses on October 31, 1517, which began the debate and discussion on the matter of indulgences, granted by the church as time off from purgatory.

As grateful as we are for God using Luther to bring the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church in the Western world back to the Scripture in this matter and others, one should take a step back and consider who influenced Martin Luther.

St. Augustine of Hippo, North Africa (354-430 A.D.) was the most consequential early church father who especially influenced a young Augustinian monk by the name of Martin Luther.

Augustine's views on grace and salvation, the church and sacraments, predestination and freewill had a profound influence on Luther.

Anti-Pelagian writings of Augustine emphasized that man has no spiritual power or cooperation within him to work in God in matters of salvation. Pelagius emphasized human action as power, will, and realization which people can produce on their own, without God.

Augustine as early as 1509 and Luther began to adopt many, but not all, of the theological stances of Augustine.

Luther indicated that man is passive as God initiates grace and salvation. He often appealed to Augustine in his theological writings and defenses of the Gospel of salvation.

Regarding the sacraments, Luther found himself in agreement and disagreement with Augustine, as Luther posited that the sacraments are not simply automatic, but have their effect as the person who receives them believes, that is, has faith in the word and promise of God.

On the matter of predestination and election to salvation, Augustine influenced Luther to see this doctrine as a matter of comfort and hope, as the sinner is rescued by God who elects us to salvation in Christ, without any human choice or effort.

Luther differed from Augustine on the teaching of purgatory, the number of sacraments, and matters relating to infused grace as opposed to a declaration of grace in Christ.

However, on the whole, Luther benefitted from and was aided in his theological development by the writings of St. Augustine, and for this we thank God.

## HYMNS THAT SING OF CHRIST: LSB 331

### “THE ADVENT OF OUR KING”

The advent of our King  
 Our prayers must now employ,  
 And we must hymns of welcome sing  
 In strains of holy joy.

The everlasting Son  
 Incarnate deigns to be,  
 Himself a servant's form puts on  
 To set His servants free.

O Zion's daughter, rise  
 To meet your lowly King,  
 Nor let your faithless heart despise  
 The peace He comes to bring.

As judge, on clouds of light,  
 He soon will come again  
 And His true members all unite  
 With Him in heav'n to reign.

Before the dawning day  
 Let sin's dark deeds be gone,  
 The sinful self be put away,  
 The new self now put on.

All glory to the Son,  
 Who comes to set us free,  
 With Father, Spirit, ever one  
 Through all eternity.

Charles Coffin wrote the text of this original Latin hymn, which was included in the *Parish Breviary* (1736). The words are so like the thoughts of Christians everywhere, as we look forward to the

advent of our King, the Lord Jesus Christ. It was almost a century later that this hymn was published, that John Chandler (1806-1876) began translating the hymns from that publication into English. *Lutheran Worship*, like most other modern hymnals, has altered Chandler's translations considerably. Says Percy Dearmer in *Songs of Praise Discussed*, "As we are bound to re-echo the theology of Parish in the reign of Louis XIV, we have modernized it rather freely, and we thus have here a paraphrase rather than a translation of Coffin."

Charles Coffin (1676-1749) was born at Buzancy in the Ardennes in Northern France and educated at Deplessis College of the University of Paris. In 1701, he became a member of the faculty at the College of Doirmans-Beauvais in the University of Paris, and its principal in 1712. From 1718-1723, he was rector of the University of Parish. Thereafter he returned to his former position at Doirmans-Beauvais.

He wrote a number of Latin hymns that were also published. Coffin's hymns, characterized as "direct and fitted with the spirit of grace," are remarkable for their pure latinity and scripturalness. We have another of his hymns in our hymnal:

*On Jordan's Bank the Baptist Cry*

The tune is St. Thomas by Aaron Williams (1731-1776) and Williams seems to have spent most of his time in and around London as a music engraver, teacher of music and psalmody, and compiler and publisher of Psalm tune collections. At one time he was also clerk of the London Wall Scots Church. Other tunes in our hymnal sung to St. Thomas are:

*I Love Your Kingdom, Lord*

## WHAT DOES THIS LOGO MEAN?



This logo takes many elements from Luther's seal, which is the most easily recognized symbol for Lutheranism. It was common in Luther's day for people to create a seal or coat of arms for their families, and that seal told the world what the family cared about or did for a living. It's no surprise, then, that Luther's seal was all about Jesus!

At the center of Luther's seal, and at the center of the Reformation 2017 logo, is a red heart in the middle of a white rose. (The heart and rose together are commonly referred to as Luther's rose.) As Luther explained in one of his writings, "The heart in the middle of white rose shows that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. It immediately sets [the believer] into the midst of a white, joyful rose, not like the peace and joy the world offers. That is why the rose should be white, not red. White is the color of the spirits and all angels."

At the center of that rose is Jesus Christ and Him crucified. Jesus is the center and Rock of our faith. He has been since He came to Earth in the flesh, and He still is today. The word "still" bears witness to the ever and ongoing relevance of this one, saving truth for sinners.

## WHAT IS A LUTHERAN?

While there are a variety of ways one could answer this question, one very important answer is simply this, "A Lutheran is a person who believes, teaches and confesses the truths of God's Word as they are summarized and confessed in the Book of Concord." The Book of Concord contains the Lutheran confessions of faith.

Perhaps you have attended an ordination of a pastor and heard him promise that he will perform the duties of his office in accord with the Lutheran Confessions. When people are received into

membership into a Lutheran congregation through confirmation they are asked if they confess the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as they have learned to know it from the Small Catechism, to be faithful and true.

These solemn promises indicate to us just how important the Lutheran Confessions are for our church.

## QUOTES FROM MARTIN LUTHER FOR REFORMATION DAY

Who better to quote on Reformation Day than the quotable Martin Luther? Below are seven quotes from Luther, beginning with a description of the German Reformer taken from an eyewitness to his famous trial (the Diet of Worms):



"Martin is of middle height, emaciated from care and study, so that you can almost count his bones through his skin. He is in the vigor of manhood and has a clear, penetrating voice. He is learned and has the Scripture at his fingers' ends. He knows Greek and Hebrew sufficiently to judge of the interpretations. A perfect forest of words and ideas stands at his command. He is affable and friendly, in no sense dour or arrogant. He is equal to anything. In company he is vivacious, jocular, always cheerful and gay no matter how hard his adversaries press him." (Bainton, 99)

### 1. Luther's reply at the Diet of Worms:

"Since then Your Majesty and your lordships desire a simply reply, I will answer without horns and without teeth. Unless I am convicted by Scripture and plain reason - I do not accept the authority of peoples and councils, for they have contradicted each other - my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. God help me. Amen." (Bainton, 180)

### 2. Luther on the exchange of our sin with Christ's righteousness:

"Who then can fully appreciate what this royal marriage means? Who can understand the riches of the glory of this grace? Here this rich and divine bridegroom Christ marries this poor, wicked harlot, redeems her from all her evil, and adorns her with all his goodness. Her sins cannot now destroy her, since they are laid upon Christ and swallowed up by him. And she has that righteousness in Christ, her husband, of which she may boast as of her own and which she can confidently

display alongside her sins in the face of death and hell and say, "If I have sinner, yet my Christ, in whom I believe, has not sinned, and all his is mine and all mine is his..." (Luther, "The Freedom of a Christian," 287)

### 3. Luther on how the Reformation came about:

"I simply taught, preached, wrote God's Word; otherwise I did nothing. And then, while I slept...the Word so greatly weakened the papacy that never a prince or emperor did such damage to it. I did nothing. The Word did it all." (George, 53)

### 4. Luther on the paradox of sinners being declared righteous:

"We are in truth and totally sinners, with regard to ourselves and our first birth. Contrariwise, in so far as Christ has been given for us, we are holy and just totally. Hence from different aspects we are said to be just and sinners at the same time." (George, 71)

### 5. Luther on the battle for the truth of the gospel:

"Our warfare is not with flesh and blood, but against spiritual wickedness in the heavenly places, against the world rulers of this darkness. Let us then stand firm and heed the trumpet of the Lord. Satan is fighting, not against us, but against Christ in us. We fight the battles of the Lord. Be strong therefore. If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Bainton, 140)

### 6. Luther on those who identified with him and followed his teachings:

"The first thing I ask is that people should not make use of my name, and should not call themselves Lutherans but Christians. What is Luther? The teaching is not mine. Nor was I crucified for anyone...How did I, poor stinking bag of maggots that I am, come to the point where people call the children of Christ by my evil name?" (George, 53)

### 7. Luther on looking to Christ for our righteousness:

This is wonderful news to believe that salvation lies outside ourselves. I am justified and acceptable to God, although there are in me sin, unrighteousness, and horror of death. Yet I must look elsewhere and see no sin. This is wonderful, not to see what I see, not to feel what I feel." (Bainton, 228)
