ISOLATION AND LONELINESS

Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous; not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing. – I Peter 3:8,9



The church is a community of believers in Jesus Christ, called by the Holy Spirit through the Gospel and joined into the body of Christ. We are connected to the Lord and to one another, and so care for one another in mercy. Assembling together on Sundays is not optional. It is God's will that you come to Divine Service to receive the gifts of Jesus.

But the sense of community and connections is not always seen in the world. Look at most people now and you will notice that there is hardly any eye contact. Many are immersed in their screens and with ear buds in place. Pressed together in large, populated cities with thousands around us and, still, people are lonely.

Most polls indicate that about 43% of Americans feel that they live in loneliness. About 47% indicate they do not have meaningful interactions with other people each day. It is not just elderly people who are feeling lonely, but young adults between 18 and 22 now can claim to be the loneliest generation.

What has happened? We are around people all the time, but we are isolated. One person has said, "We have crowded loneliness." It seems that finding and nurturing intimate friendships is difficult and getting more so.

Loneliness is hazardous to your health. Depression, dementia, and other health problems can be traced to loneliness. It can lead to early death.

So why are so many lonely? Busyness, individualism, and the ever-increasing screens are significant factors.

Families are on the move and are very mobile. Individualism puts self above others and feeds the ego, not others.

The Bible portrays the church as a communal place and the Scripture is a communal book. God did not

want to be alone and He created man. He does not desire that we be alone. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have existed in eternity.

We were created for connections not only to God through faith in Jesus, but also to be connected to one another in love as we live out our vocations.

We when are running frantically and find ourselves only immersed in screens, we lose connections to family and to others. It is a real struggle and a cultural issue, but we can miss out on the people we love who are under our roof.

As the church, we have several opportunities to serve a dark and lonely world of people.

First, we can connect people to God through faith in Jesus Christ. Set aside one day a week to gather together to hear God's Word, join in prayer and song, and to fellowship at the altar with Christ's body and blood. Slow down and come to church. Learn the spiritual discipline of meditation, silence, and solitude in God's house with other Christians.

Second, let us talk and converse about loneliness and mental health. Discuss depression, loneliness, isolation, and hurt. Grieve with those who grieve. Mourn with those who mourn. Christians need to converse about mental illness and to seek God's help and good medical care.

Finally, live life together with all. The early church gathered and shared. See Acts 2:42 for God's blueprint of communal life in the church. We show our love to God by showing love to one another, committing to one another, providing visitation to one another.

We are committed to broken people, just as our Lord Jesus was and is committed to us by his life, death, and resurrection.

"Lord Jesus, you promise never to leave us or forsake us. Grant that in the midst of loneliness, others may find fulfillment through faith in you and through loving service to their neighbor; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen."

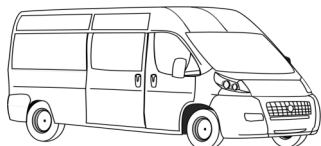

The royal banners forward go;
 The cross shows forth redemption's flow,
 Where He, by whom our flesh was made,
 Our ransom in His flesh has paid:

Where deep for us the spear was dyed,

The text of this great processional hymn by Venantius Honorius Fortunatus is supposed to have been written and first sung during a procession headed by Fortunatus to meet the bearers of fragments of the supposed true cross. Queen Rhadegunde had petitioned Emperor Justin 11 to send relics to her convent, Ste. Croix, which had been so named because of Rhadegunde's reverence for the cross of Christ. The emperor complied with her request, but routed the relic to Euphronius, Bishop of Tours, with instructions to deliver them with due honor to Ste. Croix. At the reception of the pieces of the true cross, on November 19, 569, the *Vexilla Regis* (this tune) was chanted.

At a later date, the hymn became part of vespers in Passion Week and appeared in the Roman Missal designated to be sung following the adoration of Christ on the cross.

The *Vexilla* in the opening line refers to the standards borne by the Roman cavalry whose eagle ornament of early times was replaced with a cross by Emperor Constantine (c.280-337).

Fortunatus (520-609) was born at Ceneda, near Treviso, Italy and educated in the classics at Ravenna and Milan. He was afflicted with eye trouble when young, which was miraculously cured, so the story goes, by the application of holy oil from the altar of St. Martin of Tours. Either in gratitude for the cure or to escape the imminent barbarian invasion, he left in 565 to travel to Gaul. He joined the priesthood and was made bishop of Portiers in 599. He was always heavily into mystics all his adult life. He has been called the first of the troubadours.

Other hymns by Fortunatus in our hymnal are:

Sing My Tongue, the Glorious Battle (454)

Hail Thee, Festival Day (489)

Vexilla Regis Nova is the traditional tune for this hymn and may be as old as the text. It was historically sung at Evensong on Passion Sunday and daily until Wednesday in Holy Week. Interpreted the name means Royal Banners. The author is unknown.

Prayer List via Tehnology

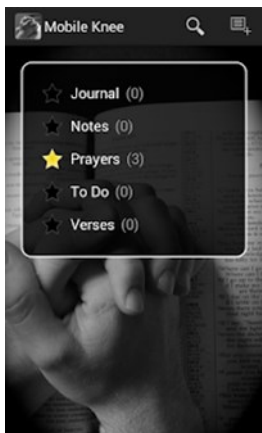


“Please keep this in your prayers.”
“Will you pray for...” How many of us have had conversations end with similar statements and we respond that we will certainly be praying. How do you handle this?

There are a couple of ways that you can respond to these or similar requests. First, you could pray with the person right there and then. Second, you could jot yourself a note until you get home and can write it down on your prayer list.

Since the vast majority of us have moved from keeping a paper and pen daily diary and instead use our phones to calendar appointments and such, we may no longer have a convenient place to also keep a prayer list. So what do you do? Search for a scrap of paper or add it to some list you already have on your phone, like your grocery list and then perhaps unintentionally forget about the prayer reminder.

Well, there is an app for that! You knew there had to be but you didn't want to recreate the wheel and the general purpose “note” app was not quite sufficient for long term use. Here is a suggestion for you: Mobile Knee.



While this app is for Android devices there are prayer apps for the Apple platform as well.

Some apps are geared toward specific theological groups with prayers and daily directions. Mobile Knees is really a straightforward list such as you might have been keeping in your day timer. It also lets you mark when prayers have been answered as well as to add sub categories so you don't have to scroll through your entire list.

For example, under prayer you might have categories such as family, work, friends, neighbors, church, etc. You can also make journal entries, jot down verses to memorize or “to do” items or various notes to yourself.

Technology can help you keep your prayer list at hand so that spare minutes spent waiting can be turned into times of ceaseless prayer.

Recent find: An Android app of Martin Luther Sermons. There are about 100 sermons available on this app. These sermons can also be downloaded to your device. Apple users can also find Martin Luther sermons at Apple Podcasts. Next time you are driving why not listen to a sermon from Martin Luther rather than your favorite radio station!

When you hear “One A Day” what is the first thing that pops into your mind? Vitamins, no doubt. Let’s look at another possible “One A Day” as a project for rainy, sick day, bored out of your mind, don’t know what to do, etc. day.

This project requires reading and writing skills so best done when you can help or if by chance you have an older child as well as a younger child home sick to help. This of course can be done when you are well and just bored.

You can actually write out the scriptures which has multiple benefits and would be preferred, or if you print out a page of various scriptures, then it just takes scissors to cut into individual scriptures.

To involve the whole family you could ask each member to contribute their favorite scriptures, scriptures that they are currently memorizing, scriptures that have been helpful to them, etc. You could even have your children canvass church friends for their favorite scriptures.

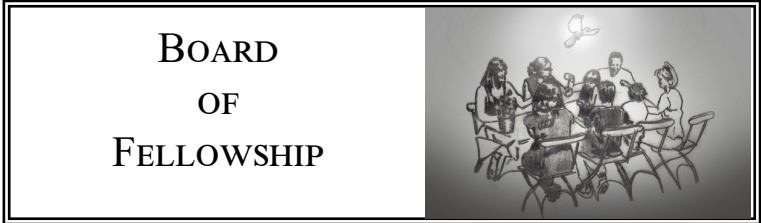
Take a clean jar with lid, make a label for the jar indicating that they are to be taken “One A Day” and then take each scripture and roll it up as tightly as possible and secure with a piece of tape or removable wafer seal, and place the scriptures in the jar. A 30 day supply is nice.

This makes a wonderful gift not only for family members but for those who are ill or homebound. You might want to make several jars of these wonderful daily supplements to have on hand!

If asked where you got this idea, say you are practicing Deut. 6:6-7!
