Merry Easter

Christ is risen. He is risen, indeed. Alleluia.

The time of Easter and its season began for us on the evening of Holy Saturday, April 11 and it ends on the Day of Pentecost, May 31.

These 50 days of Easter and its season are a joyous time of celebration and gladness as we sing our alleluias to Jesus Christ, who rose from the dead.

Easter is not merely a one-day celebration and thank God for

that. It is a fifty-day season from the Resurrection of our Lord to the Day of Pentecost, the day we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in His fullness upon the church.

About one-seventh of the church year is a victory celebration, a time for Christians to proclaim boldly their faith in the crucified, risen, and victorious Savior.

He rules his church in good times and in bad times. We have gone from the solemnity of Good Friday and the death of Jesus to the profound joy of the resurrection.

The celebration of Easter continues each week and each Sunday during the season.

Forty days after Easter, the Church celebrates the Ascension of Our Lord, on May 21, who ascended into heaven not only as God but as man. The final Sunday of the Easter season, celebrated at Pentecost, as adopted by early Christians as the day to commemorate the first great harvest of believers for Christ.

The Holy Spirit came upon the believers and they



gave their bold and compelling witness to the resurrection of

During Easter we rejoice in our salvation. We give thanks that Jesus appeared to his church as they were gathered. During these days Jesus instructed his apostles to baptize all nations and to teach His Word (Matthew 28). Our Lord showed himself, wounds and all, to verify the resurrection with the evidence that His Word is always true (John 20). Jesus bestowed the office of the keys

upon the church and authorized his pastors to forgive the sins of the penitent and to retain the sins of the impenitent (John 20). Christ ate breakfast by the sea, broke bread at Emmaus, and restored Peter by instructing him to feed the church (John 21, Luke 24).

Jesus.

The color of Easter is white, the color of our Lord's holiness. We greet one another with gladness and joy. Even amid this world's sadness, grief, and disappointments, our joy is eternal. Our joy is to spread the Gospel to all sinners so that they might repent of their sin and trust in Christ for forgiveness and eternal life.

Everyone is His witness. Disease is nothing new and neither is the Gospel. Our confession and work are essential and we are blessed to be the children of God through faith in Christ. Remain steadfast, joyful, and confident in the Word and Sacraments of Jesus Christ until He comes again to raise us from the dead, to live with him forever in the new heavens and the new earth.

Alleluia! Let praises ring! Unto the Lamb of God we sing, In whom we are elected. He bought His Church with His own blood, He cleansed her in that blessed flood, and as His bride selected. Holy, holy, Is our union And communion. His befriending Gives us joy and peace unending.

Alleluia! Let praises ring! Unto the Holy Ghost we sing For our regeneration. The saving faith in us He wrought And us unto the Bridegroom brought, Made us His chosen nation, Glory! Glory! Joy eternal, Bliss supernal; There is manna And an endless, glad hosanna.

Alleluia! Let praises ring! Unto our triune God we sing; Blest be His name for ever! With angel hosts let us adore And sing His praises evermore For all His grace and favor! Singing, ringing: Holy, holy, God is holy; Spread the story Of our God, the Lord of glory! This anonymous but beautiful hymn demonstrates the strange and interesting evolution of some hymns arriving in their final form. The roots of this text are in Martin Rinckart's *Leibliche, Geistliche, Und Himmliche Braut Messe* published in 1642. This is a hymn to the Holy Trinity. As such, it was included in numerous hymnals and soon became popular. Strangely, it is lacking in the present hymnals of the Lutheran territorial churches of Germany.

Except for the supplanting of the Hebrew Hallelujah for the Latin Alleluia, the text is that of the composite translation contained in the Lutheran Hymnal of 1941.

Rinckart (1586-1649) was born in Eilenburg, Saxony, the son of a Cooper. (A man who makes and repairs barrels and casks.) After attending the local Latin school, he later became foundation scholar and chorister of St. Thomas' School in Leipzig, graduating in 1616. He became archdeacon at Eilenburg, his birth place, where he spent the rest of his life.

During those years, the Thirty Years War (1618-1648) raged on. Eilenburg, a walled city, became a haven for vast multitudes of people fleeing the horrors of war. Thousands died from famine and plague, including his wife. For some time, Rinckart was the only pastor in the city, sometimes reading the burial service for as many as seventy persons a day. Yet, in the midst of these calamaties, he maintained his courage and trust in the Lord. He died in 1649, not only a devout and caring pastor but a talented poet. He was also a gifted musician and dramatist.

We have one more of his hymns in our hymnal:

895 - Now Than We All Our God

Wie Schon Leuchtet - This celebrated tune first appeared with Philipp Nicolai's (1556-1608) text in *Freuden Spiegel* published in 1599. Although generally attributed to him, it was undoubtedly based on a melody used as a setting for Psalm 100 in 1538. The popularity of this tune is evidenced by its frequent use on the part of Bach, Buxtehude, Mendelssohn to name three. Cathareine Winkworth (1827-1878) says of this hymn; "So popular did it become, that its tune was often chimed by city chimes, lines and verses from it were pirated by way of ornament on the common earthenware of the country, and it was invariably used at weddings and other festivals."


CAMP FIRE REPORT


You may have been doing more online work with your children than you would normally like these last few weeks. With that in mind a search was done for puzzles and games in book form that could be used during weekends and perhaps during the summer. Both Concordia Publishing and Amazon sites were searched with Amazon having many more Bible word games, crossword puzzles, find-a-word books etc. than Concordia.



Concordia has three books of Bible Word Finds though none of the three lists approximate age ranges. There were a couple of other books though listed for Grades

3-8 that might have interest. Depending on your individual child you might find Grades 2-6 more appropriate. (These were also found at "smile.amazon" though not always new.)

If you search Amazon you might start your search with "Bible Crossword Puzzles" and go from there. If your children are younger the large print books might be easier for them with the "Find-A-Word" puzzles. These would also be good for visits with grandma/



grandpa. Remember, these also make great rainy day or home sick activities.

This is a newer puzzle book and rather than just having the words to search for, the entire verse is printed in addition to the list of words. This might be a good gift for an older adult.

EASTER IN CHICO

For these 50 days of Easter, four locations in Chico, California are testifying to the resurrection of Jesus. Sing His praises and tell all of the risen Christ as you speak and invite them to church, to listen on the internet or radio, or spread Gospel material. We are loved and blessed to be His witnesses to the people in our town.





We have all been faced with social distancing safeguards from closed

business, drive-thru ordering only at our favorite eating places, boxes or footprints in the checkout lanes in grocery stores, limiting the number of people who can be in a location at one time, etc. Some of these practices may become habits such as paying more attention to distance from one another in a line. Who knows what will become safety measures we adopt for the future.

One measure that has not been mentioned with any frequency is about protecting your data on your personal devices. Perhaps this is because it seems so basic, sort of computer 101 safety instructions. And for the most part this is true, but sometimes we need to go back to basics to make sure those foundational elements are still in place.

Some who regularly work online may have a separate computer that is off limits to personal usage from family. This computer is probably connected to a company network, vetted for safety of internet connection etc., and monitored by an administrator for ongoing safety. However, some are now working online from their home computer and are facing the challenges of timesharing with the family. Some of the workarounds may be accomplished by using tablets and smartphones for some applications.

The following is important no matter what your computer and device usage is:

- Regularly change passwords and perhaps even your username. Because our current situation is causing us to spend more time on the computer exposure is therefore enlarged. If you can't remember the last time you changed passwords now would be a good time to do so. You might even calendar this for every 30-60 days especially for sensitive accounts such as your bank and credit cards.
- Make sure your computer has good virus protection. And you might also want to consider a malware application. Talk to somebody who is computer savvy if you don't know what to do.
- Review your backup strategy and if you don't

have one this would be a good time to implement one. If you don't know what to do, talk with somebody who can help show you options. You may need more than one type of backup.

- If you don't have safety precautions in place for your smartphone, review your phone operation manual as there may be at least some basic backup options included with your phone. This would also apply to your tablet whether or not it is on a data plan or wifi only. (If you don't have the manual most devices have an online manual you can download.)
- Do you have more than one email account? Consider whether or not you still need each one. Perhaps some accounts could be computer only and not linked to your phone and tablet.
- Review your installed apps and if you are still using them. If you downloaded to try something out but decided not to use it make sure you deleted it from your various devices.
- And finally, don't forget about basic maintenance to your computer and various devices. How long since you ran a defrag application on your computer? Your smartphone and tablet may have an optimization option. All of these "cleanup" options help your technology run smoother and maybe a little faster.

Hopefully these computer basics have been a good review for us all. It is easy to let these basics fall to the wayside.

One last observation: If you are spending much more time in front of a device screen don't forget to set a timer or find an app that will remind you to get up from your keyboard, stretch, do a couple of simple exercises and refill your water bottle. Technology is a wonderful tool for times such as these but it is more important than ever to use it in a godly fashion.


