## SHOULD I LAMENT OR WHINE?

There are 150 Psalms in the Bible, God's inspired hymns that are meant to be chanted by individuals or the congregation.

Psalms are typically divided into several categories, indicating their general themes.

There are 54 lament Psalms, both individual and community lament.

Seven Psalms are referred to as penitential Psalms, as we customarily use them during the season of Lent.

Additionally, there are seven Psalms that are imprecatory, where God's people call for his judgment and wrath upon the evildoer.

Thanksgiving Psalms are those in which the individual believer and the corporate church shows gratitude and thanks to God for all his blessings.

Many of the Psalms are hymnic and doxological, giving praise and glory to God for his salvation and grace in Christ.

There are several liturgical psalms, used in the temple liturgy.

Finally, there are community wisdom Psalms that extol God for giving wisdom and insight.

So, today, during this time of fires, political strife, chaos, anarchy, disease, and all the bad circumstances of daily life, are we to whine and complain, or are we to lament and cry out to God?

Clearly, the lament of God's people is called for. Lament is a theme of the Bible and this is for showing grief, deep sorrow, and regret. It is especially tied to repentance, sorrow over sin and contrition, as the sinner seeks God's forgiveness and grace in Jesus Christ, the one who died to forgive our sins.

These Psalms of lament are beautiful poems, hymns that express the human struggle well. When you don't know how to express yourself, let the Word of God in the inspired Psalms do it for you. This is a gift of the Holy Spirit that God has given us, these Psalms of lament to use in our readings and prayers.

Problems abound in life and these times are very indicative of this, as all of us have been affected by the events and times in which we live. Our church life has been affected and disrupted in many ways. The devil seems to have free reign and is ruining so much. People have become opinionated and testy.



We struggle as real people under the cross, as people of the Old Testament were real people and struggled. They expressed emotions and thoughts to God and one another, just as we do. We sing and cry. We laugh and mourn. We argue and confess. Today, we all need God's rescue and help, so we turn to the Psalms.

Start with Psalm 12. Read it and move on to Psalm 86, and all the rest of the lament Psalms.

There is a pattern in these Psalms. They begin with suffering and end with glory. They begin with an honest confession of lament over troubles in this sin-filled world, but they always end with faith and hope in the Lord, for the sake of Jesus who would suffer and die for sins.

So, today, don't whine. Rather, lament. Cry out to your Father in heaven. Let him hear your soul's complaint. Ask him to respond and help you in your plight. Place all your trust in the Lord with full confidence. Recall his past acts of faithfulness to the people of old and even in your life. He baptized you. He taught you. He has blessed you with His Word. He has protected you. And now He is still with you to provide for all your needs in Christ.

And after all this, rejoice and sing his praise as a fitting reminder of what awaits us in heaven when we join the heavenly liturgy to praise and adore our God who has heard our lament and given His all in the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Enjoy your lament to God and find fulfillment as you do so.

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)

This has been an uncertain year in so many ways, and yet our certainty in Christ is never uncertain. It is hope that never disappoints.

In searching for resources that might be useful right now the calendar says October, but Advent is coming before long. With that in mind a couple of resources that were published by Concordia Publishing House in 2018 seemed appropriate.



The first is a book for ages 3-8 based on a favorite Christmas carol. It is 16 pages so appropriate for attention span of younger ones, but creative usage with the  $2^{nd}$  resource will make this work for the whole family.

The  $2^{nd}$  resource is also titled *What Child is This?* and is a daily devotional that will work for your older children as well as adults. The theme of the pages available to sample is about hope.

Hope is probably a word you have heard frequently during these last months. Advent hope puts our focus on Christ and not our current situation.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> resource for this month comes from LWML craft and printable pages.

with the ornament. Since these ornaments are "fillable" why not fill them with a verse copied from the daily devotional pages, for example:

Dear friends of of Deaf Youth Ministry of Texas,

I normally only send a printed message like this at the end of the school year and at the end of the calendar year, but I wanted to let you know what is going on with our ministry. To put it briefly, not much! That should be changing soon. Because of Covid-19, we weren't able to go on a service trip this summer. We are planning one for next summer, though. Because of Covid-19, we haven't been able to resume our Wednesday night classes, since there are no students at Texas School for the Deaf. As of right now, all the classes are online classes. The school expects the dorm students to return to campus this month, though. It remains to be seen if they will let students off campus to attend church. We are planning all the precautions to keep the students and volunteers safe. By the time our classes start again, I should be completely healed from all the surgeries and medical procedures I have had over the last eight months. I haven't been at our youth night since last January before the heart attack. I sure miss the kids and I am looking forward to seeing them again. I have been able to keep in touch with some of them through the internet and Facebook. Two of the kids from my first youth ministry in Texas are turning 39 years old this month! How can that much time have passed? Then I look at the first deaf youth group I worked with while I was in college and realize those kids are all in their 60's now and some of them are already grandparents!

Our Director of Christian Education (DCE), Denise Pulfer, has been doing her best to keep in touch with the deaf kids over the summer. She has set up a website for us (deafyouthministrytx.org) and she keeps in e-mail contact with several of the kids. She and her family sure moved here at the right time, because she was able to keep the youth ministry going while I was in the hospital and recovering.

We are thinking of using 1 Corinthians 16:14 "Let all that you do be done in love" on the t-shirts we give out this year. Normally we have 200 shirts printed up before the first day of school. Not this year! We will wait and see what kind of attendance we will have. I'm praying it will be back to normal, but you never know. We have also discussed making face masks with our logo on them. Our logo is in the right corner of this paper.

This has turned out to be a bit longer than I expected. Sorry about that. Thank you all for the prayers and the support of our ministry. We wouldn't be able to do it without you and we are ever so thankful!

#### **Keeping Informed Via Technology**

Remember back, not too many years past, when you had subscriptions to several magazines and newspapers? You probably had subscriptions to periodicals that were specific to your profession, your hobbies, home and garden, consumer items, world events, business related issues, religious information, etc. How quickly did the pile of periodicals threaten to overwhelm your coffee table, your desk, your office until you felt like you were moving through a maze of stacks of magazines encroaching on every square inch of your living space?

Your good intentions were, as soon as the magazine was delivered, to go through it, read top articles of interest, perhaps cut out and file selected articles and then dispose of the magazine. Did you?

Focusing on just one publication today, The Lutheran Witness, many have allowed their subscriptions to lapse because of time constraints and the above mentioned accumulated stacks of magazines. Let's consider how using our technology can help us stay informed.

Are you aware that you can have a digital subscription to the Lutheran Witness either on its own or in addition to the printed magazine? To help get you started if you are interested in this option go to:

This link takes you to the Lutheran Witness site where tabs direct you to where you can read selected articles, engage with various series, view the current month's magazine, listen to podcasts, and subscribe to the monthly newsletter and/or to the printed magazine. And of course you have search capabilities.

Now the question you ask is what device do you need? You can use your phone if you have a more current smart phone. You can use your computer but unless you have a laptop this is not a good option. The option that is perhaps more viable is to have a tablet or iPad. A tablet is small enough to take along without too much trouble, plus you will have a larger screen than with a phone. A tablet is a good option if you don't want to get a new phone because all you want is to make and receive calls and your old phone still works fine.

You will need to have a tablet that allows you to connect to the internet. You certainly can have a tablet connected to a data plan with your cell phone, but one that is Wi-Fi only works in most locations today unless you are off in the wilderness somewhere. In addition many articles can be downloaded to memory so you can read off-line. So make sure you get a tablet with sufficient memory and perhaps the ability to add a memory card.



If you are thinking about getting a tablet but not sure what to get, talk to friends and family. You can purchase a tablet locally in a store or you can order from someplace like Smile.Amazon (the Amazon site where you can contribute to the charity of your choice).

Remember that technology has many godly uses. How we decide to engage with it determines if it is good or harmful. The Lutheran Witness says:


