## WE ARE LIVING IN NORMAL TIMES

While the world speaks of normal and the new normal with relation to events, circumstances, and events that affect many people, the church, God's people are always living in normal times because Jesus Christ and His Word do not change.

The Time of Christmas, as indicated in the Church Year, begins on November 29, the First Sunday in Advent, and ends on February 16, the Tuesday prior to Ash Wednesday, which is the beginning of Lent.

Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before December 25, or the Sunday closest to St. Andrew (November 30), and ends at noon on December 24.

The Church Year begins with Advent (from Latin adventus, which means coming into). This is a four-week period of preparation before Christmas. The story of Jesus during Advent is the story of hope and expectation, for when the time was just right, God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, into the world to bring forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and salvation. The Advent season teaches us to prepare to receive Jesus by repentance and faith. In Advent, we learn to wait for our coming King.

The color of Advent is blue, which symbolizes heaven, hope, joy, and expectation. The Gloria in Excelsis in the Divine Service is omitted during Advent. The Advent wreath with four candles symbolizes expectation, waiting, and hope. We gather for midweek Evening Prayer, a time of meditation, reflection, Scripture, prayer, and hymns of praise.

The Time of Christmas in the Church Year continues after Advent with Christmas and its season, December 24 – January 5.

Christmas, derived from the term Christ Mass, tells the story of Jesus as the long-awaited King who has finally come to save us. He is born in a manger in Bethlehem to be our Savior.

The season of Christmas continues for twelve days. At Christmas, we worship our God made flesh, the Word incarnate, according to John 1.

We sing the Gloria in Excelsis and join with the angels to proclaim God's mercy and grace in His Son,



Jesus Christ. The color for Christmas is white, symbolizing the deity, eternity, purity, light, and joy of Jesus Christ.

There are several lesser festivals during these days of Christmas; The Festival of St. Stephen, the first martyr, occurs on December 26. St. John, apostle and evangelist, is remembered on December 27. The death of the babies in Bethlehem is

observed on December 28 as the Festival of the Holy Innocents. The circumcision and naming of Jesus on the eighth day after his birth is celebrated on January 1.

Finally, The Time of Christmas culminates in Epiphany and its season, beginning with Evening Prayer on January 5 and ending on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday.

Epiphany is one of the oldest seasons in the Christian Church Year, second only to the Easter season. The word epiphany means a manifestation of the light, for it manifests God and man in the one person of Jesus Christ. The earliest Christians referred to this festival of Epiphany as the Theophany, the revelation of God. The Magi came to worship the baby Jesus and now all people, both Jew and Gentile, have access to God. Jesus is the new temple. The Epiphany of our Lord is marked on January 6.

Like Christmas, the Epiphany of Our Lord, the Baptism of Our Lord, and the Transfiguration of Our Lord are feast days indicated by the white color. The Sundays after Epiphany symbolize growth by the color green.

Jesus was baptized for us, to bear our sins, and we are given Jesus in our baptism. We have the forgiveness of our sins and salvation given to us in our baptism.

The Feast of the Transfiguration, celebrated on the last Sunday in the Epiphany season, commemorates the moment on the Mount of Transfiguration when three disciples of Jesus were given a glimpse of their Lord, seeing him as the center of the law and prophets, the one who would go to the cross for the sins of the

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)

It's normal for our children to be a little hyper this time of the year; however, this year has presented extraordinary challenges for families with the pandemic keeping not only children but many parents homebound. You have probably heard far too many times "I'm bored. There's nothing to do. When will it be Christmas, etc. etc?"

Last month's article talked about Advent and an alternative to an Advent wreath, the Jesse Tree. This month we'll take a look at Chrismons and some possible activities using them.

Here is a link to a site that tells you all about Chrismons, a brief explanation of the symbol, and a download for many of the Chrismon patterns. There is also an FAQ about making Chrismons.

On the website there is also a tab for "Christmas Fun and Activities" that has various activities such as word search, coloring pages and some online activities. Please preview for appropriateness for your children.

You may have boxes of your own treasured ornaments that you and your family have collected over the years. With excess stored energy this year, maybe making Chrismons for your own tree (or even a 2<sup>nd</sup> tree) could be an activity that stretches over several weeks leading up to Christmas and can involve everybody in the family.

Another possibility with the Chrismons would be to create a concentration game. You will need to print out the Chrismons onto a grid (remember you need two sets) that you print out on card stock and then cut up into playing pieces. (Avery has downloadable templates that would be ideal for this project.) This could be a project that your older children might undertake.

When done you have a portable game to take with you in the car, to play while waiting at an appointment, etc. Your children might even use this game with friends as a way of sharing Christian symbols rather than secular images. Remember to include the brief description.

A variation would be to create flashcards with symbol on one side and explanation on the reverse side. This variation could work with a younger child and an older child who reads.

One last idea would be to make some Chrismons ornaments to give as gifts. Perhaps if you have a family member who is isolated in a care facility you could make a paper tree and a few Chrismons as this could be contained in a large envelope for mailing. The Chrismons could just be printed on white paper, decorated with gold glitter (see the FAQ about materials) and then either put on the tree or left for the recipient to do.

Be creative! Advent is a great time for that.

#### BEING A GOOD LISTENER

After many months of concern over the virus and alterations of our lifestyles, many are weary and often times even depressed.

Keeping in touch with our fellow members who are alone and who do not have family to emotionally support them may be a way we can serve.

The number one thing to remember is that we need to listen more than we speak. People need to feel heard and not be told how they should feel. Secondly, we should not launch into a "fix it" mode. Often times they simply want to be listened to.

It is better not to talk over the phone but in these times, it usually is not a choice. For those that have face time, it allows one to more clearly read their expressions and make conversing easier. Don't try to fill silence even if it feels uncomfortable,. It may be better to say something back to them and paraphrase their own words. This makes the person feel as if you understand and that your are really listening.

Interactional starvation is everywhere. Let others know you empathize with how they feel. But most of all, pray for them and just be a good listener,


