

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deuteronomy 6: 6-7 ESV)

How many times have you read your child's favorite storybook to him/her? Probably enough times that even if they are not a reader yet they can recite the content as if they were reading and will quickly tell you if you leave out or change a word.

Just as having a book your child can hold we also have a children's bulletin that your child can hold and actually interact with the message. The children's bulletin contains various activities all centered on scripture.

If you have not been aware of this resource go to the church website (redeemerchico.org) and click on the tab "Bulletins/Sermons" and under the current week you can find both the Sunday bulletin and the children's bulletin to preview. This is generally posted by Thursday afternoon of the current week. However, the church website generally has the bulletin/sermons and children's bulletins available for only 4-6 weeks.

While you can download the bulletin as a pdf file, and you might want to do this, it would be best for your child to know where the children's bulletins are in the narthex so they can get their own bulletin when they enter church with you rather than having it already printed out for them. (If you can't find them ask an usher.) Once your child(ren) know where their bulletins are they will be eager to get their own each week. Remember, each child should have their own bulletin.

As favorite storybooks are read over and over again, encourage your child(ren) to save their bulletins so they can read them again or perhaps finish coloring the various pictures.

Generally the front of the bulletin has a picture related to the Gospel as well as a verse. Not only is this a good way to memorize scripture, it could be a good family activity to talk about what was in your child's bulletin as you sit over lunch on Sunday.

If you point out to your children before the service starts some of the words they might hear in the scripture readings or in pastor's sermon you might be amazed at what an early age children who appear to be off in their own world are actually able to repeat what was said especially if they have an activity that helps this along. Before long the stories from scripture will be as well-loved as favorite storybooks!

Hint: a 3-ring binder can help contain the bulletins. When a bulletin becomes *too well read* if you downloaded the pdf file you can print out a new one, thus avoiding catastrophe.



Recently the graphic from a blog brought to mind the way technology has gradually been changing words and how we use them. Is this a good news/bad news development or a little of both? Do you find yourself using an emoji rather than crafting words to convey an emotion? Do you sometimes wonder what a sender was meaning by the use of a certain emoji?

There is no doubt that signs and symbols can convey a message far more conveniently than a whole paragraph of words but there has to be mutual understanding. For example, a U-turn sign with a slash going through it may mean you can never make a Uturn. However, there may be an additional sign that says "between 7:00 - 8:30 a.m." which certainly changes your ability to make a U-turn at 10:30 a.m.



How often have you been frustrated with the "autocorrect" feature in your text or email application that if not caught totally and perhaps damagingly changes what you intended to say? Then you end up sending three additional texts, an email, a phone call and perhaps a face-toface meeting to unravel, clarify and rectify the error. The intended auto-correct

feature meant to be a help to you has hindered a relationship. So, bottom line, by all means use technology applications and devices to aid your communications, but you are still responsible for the content so don't forget to proof-read.

As we enter this New Year perhaps we need to focus on how we use all of our technology; to make sure especially that our communication brings glory to God.

Dear friends of Deaf Youth Ministry of Texas,

Even though 2020 has a been a strange and challenging year, we do have some good news to report, but before I get to that, I'd like to explain why we have a new mailing address. When I first opened the post office box, the post office was at 6th and Guadelupe. That post office was close to the church and it had a large, free parking lot. The post office later moved downtown to 9th and Congress. There was very little parking in the area and sometimes I had to park more than a block away. That was frustrating, but since I was in much better health back then, it wasn't too much of a burden. Since then, the city of Austin has removed a lot of the street parking places, so now in the entire block in front of the Post Office, there are only 4 parking places. Because of health problems and the surgery on my foot, if I can't get one of those parking places, I can't check the mail. The city of Austin has also given homeless people pretty much free reign, and the panhandlers in front of the Post Office are becoming more and more aggressive. I no longer feel safe, especially if it's after dark. Since I live in Pflugerville, as does our DCE, Denise and her family, and there is a large, free parking lot, I decided to move our post office box. Because we are box #4, it is one of the closest boxes to the front door, which makes it easy. (See address above)

Now, to news about the ministry. Covid-19 has really changed things for us. We weren't able to have a service trip last summer, but we are planning one for next summer. In the past, our snacks would always be home made cakes & brownies, fresh popped popcorn, lemonade and fruit punch. We can't do that anymore. Now all the snacks are pre-packaged. For the kids' birthdays, I used to bake their favorite cakes. I miss doing that, and the kids miss getting them.

After years of trying to convince the church to let us have a second night to

use the building, they finally agreed to let us use it on Tuesday evenings, also. So on Tuesdays, we have our Young Adults/College Age class. It has turned out better than expected. Our first class was October 6th and, so far, since then until now, we have had 27 young adults attend. 17 of them had attended when they were in high school, but 10 of them are new this year.

The school year normally would have started in August, but this year it started a month late and our first classes for Middle School and High School were on September 23rd. In Middle School, we have had 16 students, 5 of whom are new this year. In High School, we have had 21 students, 3 of whom are new this year. In our three classes - Middle School, High School and College Age - we have had a total of 64. Of those, 18 are new this year.

Even though in a normal year, we would have had at least 150 students by this time, I thank God for each and every one of these precious youth. Many of the Texas School for the Deaf students are not back on campus yet, but are taking their classes through the internet. As more students return to campus, we expect to see more attending our programs, too.

It is a real blessing to me to have so many great volunteers. Ted and Denise Pulfer, who moved here from Wisconsin, have been so helpful in teaching the classes, as have Abby Capo and my wife, Carol. I had encouraged Denise to move here with the hope that she would eventually take over the youth ministry when I am no longer able to do it.

It is also a blessing to me to have so many people who support our ministry with their prayers and, if possible, with financial support. Even if you aren't able to financially support us, we still covet your prayers. There are still people and powers who would love to see this ministry fail, but with your prayers and God defending us, this ministry should continue long after I am no longer here. It is our praver that God bless you and yours in the coming year... and always!


The fourth grant is near completion in the amount

The outreach is entitled "Hmong New Year Celebration Outreach."

The tradition of soul calling and celebrating the New Year has been practiced for centuries by the Hmong in Asia. When the Hmong people sought refuge in the USA after the Vietnam war they brought this cultural tradition with them. It is

believed by Hmong people that a person's soul may have wandered off, got lost, or couldn't find its way back with its own body during the year. A feast is held and special guests are the spirits of their ancestors. At New Year, their ancestor spirits are asked to bless the family with another year of wealth, good health, protection, and happiness. A month-long



festival then follows. In Fresno and Merced the Hmong celebrate the New Year festival in December. The festival in Fresno alone draws over 20,000 and is the largest and longest running one in North America. These festivals are a good opportunity

to share the Gospel truth to the Hmong; that it is not their ancestors who bless them yearly, but Yahweh, the creator and Living God and His amazing grace through His only Son, Jesus Christ. Printed Christian material in English and Hmong is handed out. The funds will go to purchase Luther's Small Catechism, other Christian materials, and operating costs for booths at Merced and Fresno festivals.

Hundreds of societies gather mite offerings which are gathered at the district level to fund grants. Our narthex houses a mite box to accept offerings. Each and every member of our congregation may have a mite box and information about "What is LWML?" Thanks to our donations, we are able to assist in these endeavors. AND ALL GLORY BE TO GOD !!!


