LIVING IN BRIGHT TIMES

Times and seasons come and go. Life is simply variations on a theme that is constant. There is nothing new under the sun and history simply repeats itself, according to man's sinful nature.

God's light, Jesus, came into the world. We worship Jesus, who has given all mankind access to God through himself. He showed himself to both Jew and Gentile. He manifested himself in his first miracle of turning water into wine. Jesus clearly demonstrated that He is the true Son of God, our Savior.

During this time of Epiphany and its season, which began on January 5 and which will end on Tuesday, February 16, the day before Ash Wednesday, we recall one of the oldest seasons in the church year. Epiphany is the second oldest season, Easter being the first.

This is a season of light and brightness found only in Jesus. Epiphany, or Epiphaneia in Greek, simply means the revealing of the light. Jesus, as true God and true man shows himself in word and deed to be who he claims to be and demonstrates this to all people. Gentiles have access to God, as demonstrated by the magi who worshipped baby Jesus. All people can now come to God's temple, Jesus. January 6 was the great day of Epiphany that we celebrated.

Epiphany begins as a great feast day and it concludes with the Feast of the Transfiguration of Jesus. The color of these days is white, the color of purity and holiness, calling attention to Jesus as the sinless Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. The Sundays after Epiphany are green, focusing on the growth and progress of the 3-year ministry of Jesus as he taught, healed, and spread the saving Gospel.

The first Sunday after the Epiphany we celebrated the baptism of Jesus and recall our baptism into Christ, giving God thanks for our salvation in



baptism, as it gave us forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and salvation.

The last Sunday of the Epiphany season is Transfiguration, the moment on the mountain when Jesus and three of his disciples went up for a majestic encounter with the Father, Moses and Elijah. Here Jesus proclaimed himself as the long-awaited Messiah who came to die for the sins of the world and to be raised in glory from the dead.

The Transfiguration of Our Lord is the last Sunday before Lent. We sing farewell for a while to the Alleluia, the song of gladness.

The Epiphany season in the church year reminds us that Jesus is always with us, blessing us with his deeds and words, which are always for our good. Amid our troubled and stressful lives, we rejoice in the light, the bright times in which we live as the light of the world, Jesus, enlightens our hearts and minds with his word and sacraments.

We make this known to all people as we live our daily vocations. Christians live as light and salt in this world, to make known the saving deeds of Jesus. We invite all to come and see. We seek the lost and carry the Gospel where God has placed us. The end is not yet and there is much we will endure, but the bright light of Jesus is shining where he has placed it, in his church, the body of Christ, that bears the light of Jesus to all people. The world is a dark place and hell is the destination of all who reject Jesus. Thank God we are saved and live in the light of his presence as Scripture guides and leads us to the eternal light in his presence.

In the meantime, God bless your Epiphany, living in the light, and spreading the light to all.

TECHNOLOGY



Technology Decisions?

Many who might be reading this newsletter remember days when we didn't have instant information of the events happening in our country and the world. Perhaps you even remember when there was a newsreel when you went to the movie theater meant to give you the latest news. You got your news from the radio and the newspaper primarily and then stories and feature articles *about* the news in magazines either monthly or perhaps weekly. And then came television...

Today technology has given us almost instant access to what is going on all around us, but many question the motive behind many of these instant "news" reports and the truthfulness. Technology, however, has given us incredible advances in medical diagnostic tools, the ability to check on weather when planning a trip, help in navigation for those who are map-navigation-challenged, help in locating missing persons, and the list goes on of incredibly useful resources for personal, business, social and other needs.

Many of you may be familiar with a conservation motto from World War II that was frequently credited to New England, "Use it up, wear it out, make it do or do without." However, as much as it would be nice, that doesn't generally apply to our technology devices. And so, you may be facing technology decisions as to whether it is time to upgrade or replace one or more of your devices.

What do you do? Well, if it stops working the decision is easier; see if it can be fixed or get a new one. What if it is still working but you are not able to do some of what needs to be done. For example, your doctor wants you to submit weekly or perhaps even daily, various physical measurements via an electronic portal. You have family in extremely remote locations and the only way of contact is via electronic means. These are issues that make the decision more pressing.

So how do you make the decision? First of all what will assist you in day-to-day living, and then what helps you stay connected with family, friends, work, medical facilities, etc. Then search out, with help from a friend perhaps, the device that not only meets your needs but gives you some room to adapt to new technology as it develops. Ask questions, lots of them, but try not to wait until your device stops working and then feel pressured to purchase a new device on the spot.

The other decision that some are finding they need

to make is regarding applications, computer programs and their value for their own lives. This is perhaps a more difficult decision especially if it is an app you use frequently. Don't neglect entering into dialog with family and friends, your pastor and other Christian sources regarding this decision. Ask the hard questions about whether it is needful or harmful, productive or addictive, God honoring or lacking in virtue. And this is a personal decision ultimately.

Praise God for the continuing advances in technology that supplies information and enriches our lives. Continue to seek His guidance in how it is used.



And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)

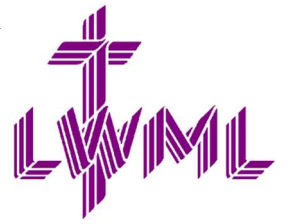

The mission of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is to assist each woman of the Lutheran Church.



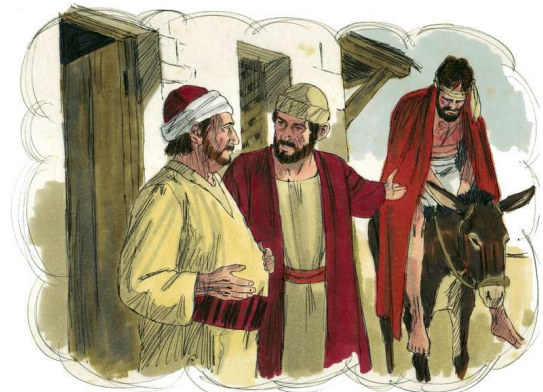
LWML provides opportunities for personal spiritual growth, richer prayer life, and retreating into the Word of God.

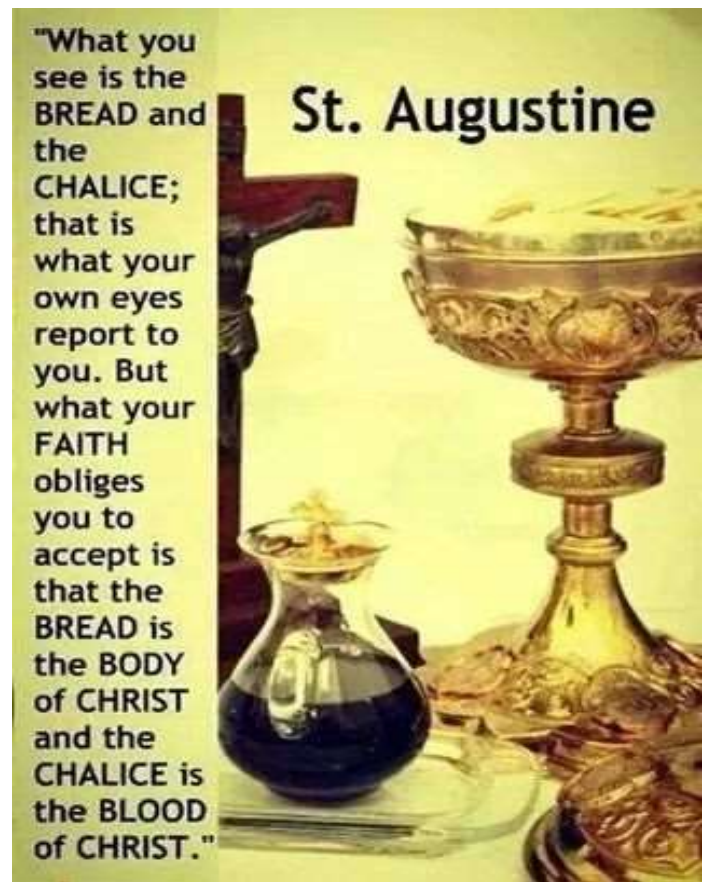
Near the end of the Christmas season, there is a prayer before communion that perfectly sums up the season of Epiphany:
