

I JUST WANT TO FEEL GOOD ABOUT MYSELF

Beware of Moralistic Therapeutic Deism (MTD), a worldview in which God is thought to be undemanding, simply wanting people to feel good about themselves and to be morally upright, happy and successful.

MTD is a widely held belief and very widespread in the United States. The term Moralistic Therapeutic Deism was coined by Christian Smith and Melinda Lindquist Denton in their book, Soul-Searching in 2009.

Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation (2017) refers to this false teaching in Question 41, p.66. It explains how MTD is essentially a blending of non-Christian religions and a generic deity.

The rise of MTD is shaped by the American idea of individual freedom and personally held beliefs - in politics and religion. In the United States many people are quite comfortable with the idea that there is no absolute truth and the religious beliefs are best held privately, not publicly. MTD supposedly allows people to live peacefully because the god of MTD is very tolerant and does not challenge the various religions and lifestyles advocated in American culture.

In fact, many embrace Moralistic Therapeutic Deism because they have been taught it by the church. This worldview is colonizing and influencing the Christian church. People do not need to leave their church to embrace MTD.

Moralistic Therapeutic Deism is like a virus because it cannot exist on its own. It needs a host and American Christianity has proved to be a gracious host to MTD. We reap what we sow in the church. All too often churches and pastors have taught that a well-articulated belief system is not necessary and might even be an obstacle to authentic faith. Too many churches are emphasizing an emotional relationship with Jesus over Scriptural content.

So, we receive what we have asked for. A relationship with God, not conviction; compliance with culture, not faith. The sad price for being nonconfessional has been paid.



If there is such a thing as a creed in MTD, this would be it.

1. A God exists who created and orders the world and watches over human life on earth.

2. God wants people to be good, nice, and fair to each other.

3. The central goal of life is to be happy and to feel good about oneself.

4. God does not need to be particularly involved in one's life except when God is needed to solve a problem.

5. Good people go to heaven when they die.

How do we respond to MTD with the Bible and our Lutheran Confessions? Here is a simple response.

"I believe in the Holy Spirit" is our creedal confession. It is impossible for sinners to be moral or good enough to satisfy God's standard of perfection. We are not saved by our works or morals, because we are by nature sinful and unclean. Romans 3:10 and 3:20 refute this notion of salvation by works or goodness. Only the Holy Spirit can give us saving faith and cause us to do good works in response to our salvation in Jesus alone. Our goal is not to feel good about ourselves, but to worship and serve the true and living God and to love our neighbor.

God has always been involved in the lives of his people. He worked among them and sent his Son, Jesus Christ, at just the right time to live, die, rise, and ascend for us and our salvation. God did not wait until we were morally good enough. He gave His Son for sinners like you and me at just the right time. He chose us in Christ and baptized us. He continues to feed us with His Word and sacraments. Those who embrace MTD do not wish to impose their beliefs on others. But, only those who trust in Christ can be saved. It is not true that good people go to heaven. We are called to be witnesses and confessors of Jesus as the only way to eternal life.

The Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is very much involved in the world and our daily lives. He is our Creator, Redeemer,

The Time of Christmas – Advent



Begins the fourth Sunday before December 25, or the Sunday closest to St. Andrew (November 30), and ends with midday prayer on December 24.

The Savior's birth is second in importance only to his resurrection

on Easter Sunday. During the time of Christmas, Christians reflect on God's great and gracious gift of Himself.

The Church Year begins with Advent (from Latin *adventus,* which means "coming into"), a four-week period of preparation before Christmas. The story of Jesus during Advent is the story of hope coming into the world. When the time was just right, God sent His Son, into the world. The Advent season teaches us to prepare to receive Jesus, the hope of the world.

In Advent, we wait for our coming King.

The color for Advent is blue, which symbolizes anticipation and hope in our coming King.

Advent is a semi-penitential season, emphasizing repentance and contrition over sin.

We do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis in the Divine Service during Advent. This is the angel's song at Christmas, so during Advent, we pass over this traditional Hymn of Praise in silent anticipation.


It has become common to use an Advent wreath to mark the season. This wreath has four candles – one for each week in Advent. As these candles are lit each week, our anticipation mounts as we look forward to Jesus' coming.

We gather for midweek services. These services heighten our awareness and anticipation for the celebration of Christ's coming in the flesh.

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)



One of the things necessary in keeping resources for children alive and active is that the parents are encouraged. Sometimes the books written for children fail to meet the level of your children. You know them best and what will spark their interest but with busy lives you just plain run out of creativity and can use some

input. This book may help.

The book *Behold the Child* while listed as being for young adult to mature adult, reviews of the book say "*They're simple enough for young children, yet well-put and theologically substantial.*" You may need to adjust or paraphrase for very young children, but for say 2nd grade and up being exposed to slightly more advanced vocabulary is a good thing.

The book is available from CPH.org as well as in eBook format from Amazon (use Smile.Amazon). Having both a printed copy as well as one on your phone or tablet may be beneficial.

While classified as an Advent book it really is a little more. It starts on December 1st (not first Sunday in Advent) and continues through January 6, Epiphany. This lets you explain that the Christmas season is not just Christmas Day.

Wearable medical alert devices have been available for several years now and can bring peace of mind for many. If you have a family member with medical issues you may have already looked into this technology. Depending on the device you can expect to pay anywhere from \$20.00 per month to over \$100.00 depending on the services. Your insurance may or may not cover any of the cost. However, in

many situations this brings great peace of mind. What about the healthy, active, very independent family member or friend still living on their own but who could benefit from some type of location finder at least for occasional usage? In the recent past GPS apps for phones have become more reliable and might be worth considering.

If you have children in the home you might already have a GPS app that you have installed on your kids phone and you could simply add another person to the account. Even if you do have such an app you still might want to consider one that is a little different.

There are apps that work mobile to mobile as well as those that also can have a desktop application. Most of these apps can be activated or deactivated so they are not running all the time. For example, mom or dad plans going for a walk and expects to be gone for approximately an hour. The app can be set for real time GPS or notification when walk is complete. This is also great if they are traveling. Many of the apps can be set for incremental destinations and even send an announcement when each destination point has been reached.

Some of the cellphone providers have a free GPS locator as part of their service, with options to upgrade to one with more options for a minimal fee. Check this out. If your cellphone provider does not include a locator GPS search your Android or Apple apps store. Make sure to read the reviews and do some research on the features.

Make sure to talk with your family about the value of using a personal location GPS app. It's not about limiting their mobility or freedom but about safety and using technology in a godly manner.

Dear Partners and Friends.

Merry Christmas from all of us here at the Women's Resource Clinic to you and your family!

Christmas is a special time of the year for those of us who serve the woman with an unplanned pregnancy. Jesus, the King of Kings, chosen of the Father, humbly enters this world. Carried by his mother Mary in an "unplanned pregnancy" by human standards, yet planned of God from the foundations of time. Having received the Good News from the angel Gabriel, Mary endures the stigma and uncertainties. So too, we minister to the woman who suffers a pregnancy she did not plan and who fears the worst. But our client advocates serve as God's messengers and deliver the good news: irrespective of the circumstances of conception or the surrounding to which the child will be born, God has a plan for her and her child's life; a plan to give a future and a hope.

Allow me to share with you the story of one of our clients, and how the love and hope shared from the Clinic helped carry her through her darkest hour.

As I listened to the voice on the phone, it was obvious the young woman was upset and feeling desperate. "Suzy" told me she had been raped and as a result was now pregnant. She did not know what to do. Suzy was struggling with shame, fear and anger. She wanted to know; was abortion the answer to her pain? As she told me her story, I could only pray. As we began to talk, I encouraged her to keep her child. I shared with her how God is able to use all the circumstances of our lives, and will give them meaning and purpose, especially situations that appear most difficult. I prayed over the phone for Suzy and I asked the Lord for a miracle. That night, God spoke through a dream to a very close friend of Suzy. The friend told her he dreamt he saw her holding a little girl. Suzy called me back the next day to tell me about her friend's dream. I told her I thought God was trying to speak to her heart about her unborn baby. While Suzy had to deal with so much anger and emotional pain from the rape, she nonetheless decided to keep her child. And when she heard on the ultrasound her baby's heartbeat for the first time, the feelings of anger began to melt away, and were replaced with a mother's love for her baby. Now when she holds her daughter in her arms and looks into her eyes, she understands her baby is not at fault for the rape, but rather this baby of hers is a gift from God.

ETIQUETTE FOR HOSPITAL VISITS

As visitations are more readily permitted, we remember that there are things we should remember. Guidelines from the hospital may vary from time to time so be aware.

- 1. Make your visit brief. (10-15 minutes may be all a patient has energy for)
- 2. Be sensitive to reason patient is in the hospital and try to not "over visit" a patient and if possible get guidance from family.
- 3. As Christians, we bring Christ's love to fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Avoid talking about someone else who went through same procedure and what complications they had. BE CHEERFUL!
- 4. How is your own health? Never visit someone if you don't feel well.
- 5. Gift guidelines If flowers are your idea, be certain patient is not allergic. When allowed, bring them in a vase; preferably a disposal type.
- 6. Avoid bringing food gifts to hospital. Many are on restricted diets.
- 7. Balloons are fun but only latex-free type like mylar should be gifted.
- 8. Cards are a simple and wonderful gift. They are a way of letting the person know they are thought of and prayed for. Mail them to their home as hospital stay length varies.

Mercy servants now number ten. They visit members as well as non-members. Please pray

for all of them.

Blood donations are always needed. Appointments are to be made directly with VITALANT, 893-5433 or <u>www.vitalant.org</u>. Donors must be in good health, weigh at least 110# and be well hydrated. There is no upper age limit.


